Congratulations to Deloris Carhee, former Conference President and Haejin Ban, Conference Korean Language Coordinator who were elected along with four others to represent SEJ on the National Board. These ladies will serve as Directors on the National Board for 2021-2024 Quadrennial. I was elected to serve on the SEJ Planning Committee for the next quadrennial.

tool for us to be together, even if it is virtually.



\$MYRNA FIR\$T ANNUAL UMW Ice Cream Social 2020



They are making sure to meet everyone needs to the best of their ability while practicing social distancing, and wearing face coverings to reduce the spread of Covid-19. We are in unprecedented times. Let's remember our sacrificial gifts to assist our Institutions. Think about how your Units might help in this season. Here are just a few of the activities and measures taken, I'd like to share

with you from our Mission Institutions.



New Bethlehem

The staff at Murphy-Harpst are thinking of new ways to keep kids inspired during Covid-19 since they can no longer accept visitors or take off-campus field trips by hosting a socially-distance Gallery and Art Show. Many of the residents have their first breakthrough in Art Therapy and it is a key component to the kids healing journeys. Some of the young artists sold their art pieces to staff members for extra allowance money and supporters on social media have expressed interest in a Virtual Art Show! Paine College

A unique time such as this required a unique response for Institutions of learning. Paine College's goal has always been to provide a transformational education experience preparing students for the ever-changing world. The fall semester is already underway instructing students through virtual learning to ensure no interruption their education. at home with your children, grandchildren, family members, neighbors and friends. The children's study this year is *Managing Our Emotions* by Faye Wilson and Trudy Rankin. What better time is there to be talking to children about emotions than this time of stress and uncertainty as we self-isolate and quarantine at home? If you want to do the study at home with children who are special in your life, or share this info with others, you will need:



The study book, available at the resource center

Managing Our Emotions helps children learn about their emotions and accept God's gift of their entire range of emotions (sadness, joy, excitement, fear and frustration to name just a few) through four two-hour sessions.

- Authors Trudy Rankin and Faye Wilson designed the four sessions to help children (and leaders) explore both positive and negative emotions. The study uses scripture memorization, Bible study and prayer, as well as exercises such as "tapping" or the Emotional Freedom Technique, to help children manage feelings in a positive and healthy way.
- This study encourages all of us—participants and study leaders alike—to be aware of our feelings, understand what the Bible teaches us about the role of feelings in our lives, find ways we can cultivate strength to deal with challenges, and discover a community in which to celebrate.
