# **Second Legislative and Call-in Day June 22**

As a follow up to our very successful climate justice federal legislative day in April, please register and join us for a second legislative and call-in day that will take place June 22. Congress is currently working on infrastructure legislation, and we want Congress to hear that women of faith are urging them to advance infrastructure legislation that accelerates the transition to renewable energy with equitable and just policies.

We will be organizing legislative visits for eight states: West Virginia, Arizona, Michigan, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Alaska, Georgia and Nevada. NRPE will be setting up all meetings. The meetings will be held June 22, 1-4PM ET (11AM-1PM AKT for those in Alaska). A pre-briefing and training session will be held on June 21, 4-6PM

ET, and will include a review of climate justice and energy and transportation issues, training on how to conduct a virtual Senate meeting, and time to plan your legislative visits with others in your state.

People from all states are encouraged to call their Congressional representatives at any time on June 22, 2021. You can use this link, which provides a script and will connect you directly to your elected officials.

### Day of Giving — A Success!

Thank you to all who participated and donated to our legacy and future in this year's March 23 Day of Giving. The first-ever 6-hour Live Day of Giving Facebook event resulted in more calls to give and more one-day online donations than ever before. A total of \$303,224 was raised for

As a permanently invested endowment, The Legacy Endowment Fund will forever be a source of income for United Methodist Women. The endowment assures that United Methodist Women can provide the life-affirming, compassionate care and support that heals, restores and empowers populations of women, children and youth in the years and decades to come.

In 2014, the Board of Directors launched The Legacy Endowment Fund Campaign, setting a goal in 2017 to raise \$60 million dollars. During the campaign's six-year history, communities of United Methodist Women across the globe raised over \$34 million dollars! There is still a lot of road ahead of us to reach that ambitious, yet reachable goal.

By building on the accomplishments achieved to date and strengthening that momentum with a range of activities, together we will build our legacy and generate an additional \$25 million. As of April 15, 2021, we have raised \$35,659,582 which represents 59% of the total goal and includes cash and \$5,900,000 in planned gifts.

- Connect with local and district groups. Start a book club, download books onto an e-reader to pass around and share, present book reviews at group meetings.




- **Display a progress chart** in your church for all who wish to participate, and post displays to encourage book sales.

Bearing Witness in the Kin-dom: Living Into the Church's Moral Witness through Radical Discipleship...LEADERS: (KOREAN) Rev. Millie Kim, (Adult) Rev. Eric Powell and Mary Anne Brannon, (HISPANIC) Debora Constable | The church's track record in these moments is far from perfect. The purpose of this study is to help the church and its members discern our call and bear witness to the will of God for a more just world.

**Becoming Peacemakers in a Culture of Violence** (YOUTH)...LEADERS: Rev. Elizabeth Pollard, Rev. Dr. Stephen Redmond | Throughout this study, the goal is to take time to have deeper conversations about how we define violence, what the root causes of violence are, and ultimately, how God is calling us to respond. At the same time, the study seeks to guide young people to develop their capacity as peacemakers as an expression of their faith.

**Responding to Violence** (CHILDREN)...**LEADER: Lauren Breck** | This study provides the opportunity to reach children, their parents and guardians with information and techniques that will help prepare them for the violence that they will unfortunately encounter over the course of their lives.

We have sought new ways to connect with each other, the church, and the community during these challenging times, including through virtual and outdoor circle meetings, encouraging card writing to shut-ins and others who might feel isolated, and even holding our traditional bake sale fundraiser virtually. This bake sale raised funds for our annual Thanksgiving food drive and the women's shelter Family Haven.

**Bethel** The ladies from the Bethel Stockbridge JOY Circle came together to create some special 'puppet joy' for our young brothers and sisters in Honduras. It was wonderful to stretch creative muscles

knowing how much fun they will have using these puppets in ministry in Honduras.

**Dunwoody** UMW members continued with our 15-year tradition of providing meals for the women served by Action Ministries at the Grace UMC Women's Community Kitchen. Since last fall, we fed over 480 hungry ladies. We altered our routine and cooked the meal in the church's kitchen since it qualifies as a "commercial" kitchen. In addition to the hamburger

casserole, green beans, and dessert, we took hygiene and dental kits donated by the members.

**Grace** Department Mobile Unit held a Covid-19 vaccination drive at Grace UMC in Covington. 100 people were given the



vaccine. People throughout Covington and the surrounding areas came out in support of us, and many church members served as volunteers. The vaccine drive was a big success! We are grateful to the church volunteers, GNR Mobile Unit, and Department of Health and Human Services. A Call to Prayer and Self Denial is an observance in sisterhood with women from the local unit and the global community. This year's theme was "She Leads: Empowering Women to Make a Difference." All were welcomed to come pray, learn, and offer gifts that will make a real change in the lives of women, children, and youth.

**Cedar Grove** The Esther Dorcas Unit of Cedar Grove UMC in Conley has continued our efforts to fulfill the UMW mission and



purpose. We remained faithful by holding virtual monthly meetings. Earlier this year, we prepared 91 bags with toiletries, snacks, water, socks, etc., for a homeless organization, "Love Beyond Walls". Recently, we were blessed to be able donate shoes to participate in the Wellroot Shoe Drive.

**Avondale Pattillo** supports the local food pantry, Decatur-Area Emergency Assistance Ministry (DEAM), with donations of food and monetary gifts. The pantry gets a lot of food donations from area churches and other businesses, but often runs low on personal care products, especially women's hygiene products. Our UMW unit is presently collecting these much needed items in a special drive, which started on March 1st and will continue until May 1st. We have already delivered several large bags of these items to the DEAM food pantry and will deliver several more when our drive is over. Our unit also sends seasonal greeting cards and easy craft projects to our homebound church members throughout the year.

Oak Grove During the pandemic, the Monrovia UMWs reached out to Oak Grove UMW and asked for us to help them raise money to complete the building of a dormitory. They did extensive work in providing numbers, showing us exactly how much it would cost, and we talked to their District Superintendent (whom we knew from our prior trips over there), who assured us that these women were women of integrity and would do exactly what they said they would do with the money. In the past, we have sent all funds that we raised to a bank account supervised by the District Superintendent, and all funds have arrived safely.

Oak Grove, again faced with a major fundraising challenge, decided to take the project to our new District Board and present it as a challenge for the entire district. The District Board voted unanimously to support the project.

The goal for the project is \$110,000.00 and, to date, we have raised \$13,000.00.
