- Are we changemakers?



The United Methodist Church has a policy of fiscal transparency. United Women in Faith adhere to this policy and report in detail each year where our financial support has gone. It is amazing to see all the different projects we support and how much we gave to each one. Included in the report are the annual grants made to our National and International Missions, supplemental (designated) giving to each mission, and special funds that are distributed through a grant process. So you would think with this level of transparency that there would be no inaccurate information floating around. Sadly, that is not the case. I will be clear, United Women in Faith does not give financial support to Black Lives Matter and Planned Parenthood.

UWF supports programs in the United States and around the world that improve life for women, children and youth and their

communities. As the trusted steward of generous donations, we give to partner church, ecumenical and grassroots projects through a granting process overseen by a member-chosen, 25-member Board of Directors composed of United Women in Faith members.

United Women in Faith does not fund projects and programs that:

- Don't benefit women, children, or youth
- Don't comply with our UMC Social Principles
- Are administered by discriminatory organizations

House Bill 356 Eliminates For Profit Prisons

Our two main focuses for this quadrennial are Climate Justice and Mass Incarceration and Criminalization of Communities of Color. Right now we have an excellent opportunity to affect change relating to Mass Incarceration. House Bill 376 has been introduced in the Georgia House of Representatives that would eliminate For Profit Prisons in our state.

For Profit Prisons make a lot of money for the corporations that build and run them, but most of their inmates receive inadequate nourishment and little to no medical care. The 3 largest of these corporations have spent more than \$45 million on campaign donations and lobbying to keep politicians voting for their private money makers. Two of these corporations have built and filled 9 prisons or detention centers across our state.

- The US has 5% of the world population, but 25% of all the inmates in the world
- Georgia has more people in prison and on probation than any other state
- States sign agreements with these corporations to guarantee to fill a certain percentage of prison beds. The most common rate is 90%, but some agreements are for 100% filled
- Private facilities often use prison labor to generate revenue and provide little to no wages. The Georgia correctional system does not guarantee any compensation for prison labor. The minimum wage for prison labor is zero.

United Women in Faith is uniquely organized for such a task as this. We have units all over our state and if we make our voices heard to those who represent us, they will be compelled to listen to us. Please call or email your state representative. Also, forward this information to people you know: your circles, your friends and through Facebook and Twitter. NBCC is one of the four National Mission Institutions we have in North Georgia. Thanks to your / our generous financial support, the board of directors of NBCC chose us as this year's winner.

Stephanie Dressler, NGUWF president, Jessica Godfrey, NGUWF vice-president and Diane Davies, South East District president were present to accept the award from Ms Sheridan Glaze, Executive Director of NBCC. Diane also serves on the organization's board of directors.

When Ms Glaze announced that we had been chosen as the "winner," our response was a humble, surprised and excited "thank you!" But in reality, it is the women, children, youth (and men) who come to the NBCC for the myriad of programs, classes, social opportunities, social skills and leadership training, and the food pantry who, day in and day out, are The True Winners. Because of your gifts and donations, the non-profit ministry is able to work and serve in the

community. We on the executive leadership team thank you but the true gratitude is from the staff and beneficiaries of New Bethlehem Community Center. More about this National Mission institution can be found at https://www.nbccaugustaga1.com/

As mentioned earlier, NBCC is one of four National Mission Institutions we have within the North Georgia Conference. Also in Augusta is Paine College, a liberal arts, coeducational, Methodist church-related school. www.paine.edu.

In the Wesleyan tradition of valuing education for all, another Methodist Church-related college and NMI is Clark-Atlanta University in Atlanta. CAU is a "culturally diverse, researchintensive, liberal arts institution that prepares and transforms the lives of students." www.cau.edu.

The fourth National Mission Institution we are blessed to have in our area is Murphy-Harpst Children's Center in Cedartown. It is a non-profit, residential treatment center where children and youth who have been abused can find an "emotional, spiritual, and physical safe haven." www.murphyharpst.org.

Our gifts benefit the spectrum of God's children, from the young and vulnerable through young adults seeking a quality higher education to families, at risk youth and senior citizens.



Each quarter of the year we designate a special offering, Supplemental Giving aka "Quarterly Giving," to one of the NMIs. The first quarter of the **2023 Supplemental Giving**, made in your circles and units and sent to your District Treasurer, is designated to New Bethlehem Community Center. Likewise, throughout the year supplemental gifts are designated as follows:

Second Quarter (April 1 – June 30) Paine College **Third Quarter** (July 1 – September 30), Clark-Atlanta University

Fourth Quarter (October 1 – December 31) Murphy-Harpst Children's Centers

Because 2023 is still fairly "young," it is not too late to hold a Pledge to Missions program, using the wonderful program in our 2023 Program Book, in case your unit has not yet had a service.

We will soon enter into the season of Lent which is the perfect time to hold a quiet day service, aka the "Call to Prayer." The program highlights unique services and ministries our UWF support; funds from the offering go directly to fulfill grant requests and services provided by our NMIs nation-wide.

Other avenues of giving are under the umbrella of "The Five Channels of Giving." Besides the Pledge to Mission, they are Special Mission Recognition Pins, Gift to Mission Cards, Memorial Gift Cards, and the World Thank Offering.

If you are considering a service project, retreat, or a field trip, consider visiting one of our North Georgia National Mission Institutions! Contact the NMI liaison at the organization to schedule a visit / tour and inquire about volunteering for a day or ask what donations you could bring. The time you spend meeting the staff and seeing "where our money goes" will be time well spent.

Have a reflective and renewing Lenten Season and include one of Five Channels of Giving and a gift to our quarterly NMI in your unit program. Peace & joy.
